You'll experience the time of your life at GSMS during summer 2017

Applications for the West Virginia Governor's School for Mathematics and Science (GSMS), a summer residential program providing academic enrichment in the areas of science and math for current 7th and 8th graders living in and attending school in West Virginia, can be found at www.govschools.wv.gov

West Virginia University and West Virginia State University are the sites for GSMS in 2017. Programs for students who are currently in the seventh grade will be held at WVU. There are two sessions of 48 students each, making the opportunity available for a greater number of students. The first session will be June 14-22; the second will be June 23-July 1.

All current eighth-grade students will apply to attend the school at West Virginia State University in Institute. Selected statewide for their outstanding performance and interest in the fields of mathematics and science, these young scientists will spend two weeks working alongside teachers and scientists at the University as they consider possibilities for solving real-life problems. The theme, "Building a Sustainable Future," will involve problem solving and solution finding to prepare the students for a lifetime of responsible living. The dates for that session are July 10-23.
